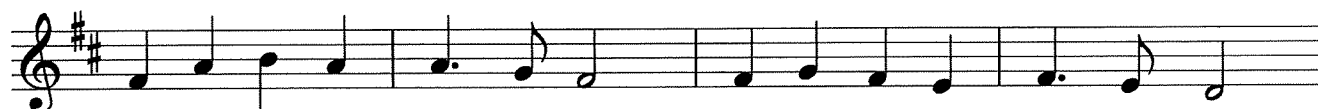

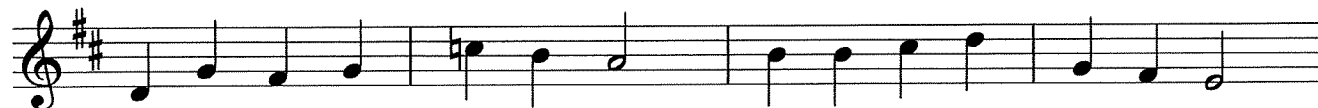

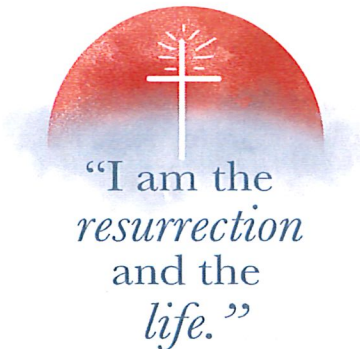
People *Glory to you, Lord Christ.*



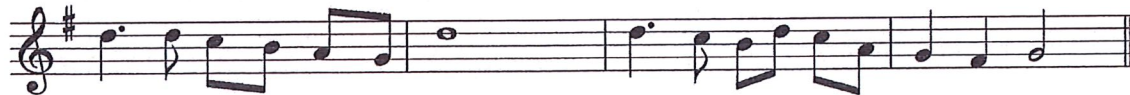
